Cannabis sales remain steady with over \$39 million in September

SANTA FE—The Cannabis Control Division of the Regulation and Licensing Department on Friday announced that during the month of September, licensed retailers around the state sold over \$39 million in adult-use and medical cannabis combined.

In September, adult-use cannabis sales topped over \$24 million.
